Kick It California began in 1992, and is staffed with caring, trained professionals. YVAPE began in 2019 and is run by the same dedicated staff.

YVAPE is a free educational and alternative means of correction intervention with phone and video coaching support for students who have been found with or under the influence of **nicotine** and/or **marijuana** at school.

YVAPE is available to California schools with students 12 years and older. YVAPE is provided in English and Spanish.

Student Enrollment

Eligibility

- Student is 12 years or older.
- Student was found with or under the influence of nicotine and/or marijuana at school.
- Student has an email address and access to a phone or Zoom.

Consent

- The student and parent/guardian (of students 12-17 years old) will provide their verbal consent to school personnel to be enrolled in YVAPE.
- School personnel will provide the student and parent/guardian with the **opt out form**.
- Students can opt out of YVAPE at any time by signing the opt out form or informing YVAPE. YVAPE will notify the school.

Enrollment

Enter the student's and parent's/guardian's information into the program's web enrollment form at **yvape.org**.

The Program

Initial Call: The IC covers nicotine and marijuana use, health, motivation and confidence about cessation, and goal setting (20–30 mins).

- YVAPE calls can be completed between 7am-9pm (M-F) and 9am-5pm (Saturday).
- YVAPE's coaching approach focuses on personal responsibility, is nonjudgmental and student-centered.

Videos and Discussion: Watch at least three of the <u>YVAPE Videos</u> and use the <u>YVAPE Discussion Guide</u> to talk about topics related to the videos. Videos are 2-4 minutes each.

Video topics:

- » Marketing Manipulation
- » Health Effects of Vaping
- » Top 6 Tips to Quit Nicotine Vapes
- » Nicotine and Mental Health
- » Marijuana and Mental Health
- » Vaping Marijuana

- » Vaping Marijuana: Your Brain and Lungs
- » Dealing with Stress
- » Asking for Help
- » Understanding Motivation
- » Personal Responsibility

Follow-up Call: The FC covers nicotine and marijuana use, the videos, and their goal (10-15 mins). This call completes YVAPE.

Optional Check-in Call: Students can receive an additional check-in call for extra support (5-10 mins).

Completion

The school, student, and parent will be notified when the student completes YVAPE. The student will receive a certificate of completion (completion is typically 1 to 14 days).

- If the student has not completed YVAPE within 4 weeks, YVAPE will email the school, student, and parent/guardian.
- The student can be reactivated any time, which restarts call attempts

Additional Activities

Referral to Kick It California (KIC): YVAPE students can be referred to KIC during their follow up call for help quitting.

Optional 3-month Evaluation: Students who consent for eval will be contacted to answer questions about their substance use and experience in YVAPE (5-10 mins; \$10 gift card).


Re-referral to YVAPE: Students who are re-referred to YVAPE will receive extra modules on triggers, strategies, and stress management.

Reports: YVAPE provides schools with confidential aggregate reports with the number of students enrolled and their completion statuses.
